It's all about our patients

At QCH, our patients are our focus.

From reducing wait times in the Emergency Department to helping seniors return home safely, we're seeing the benefits of this 'Patients First' approach to care.

Sometimes, little things make a big difference. For example, daily team huddles in the ER provide an instant picture of what the day looks like, keeping all staff up-to-date in this large and busy department. And a streamlined discharge model for Medicine patients is improving coordination to help prepare patients and families for their discharge home.

"It's about getting the staff's ideas and incorporating these into new ways of organizing care," explains Maureen Taylor-Greenly, Vice President, Patient Care and Chief

Nursing Officer. "We are focusing on the 'why' behind the way we do things, with the ultimate goal of a better care experience for our patients and a better work experience for our staff and physicians.' The Home First program,

collaboration with the Champlain Local Health Integration Network and Community Care Access Centre, is another great example. The expectation is that every patient will go home, with the most appropriate care in the

most appropriate setting in place. The entire care team is involved in developing a personalized care plan to ensure a safe return home.



Queensway Carleton Hospital receives highest Accreditation award

Last November, QCH welcomed surveyors from Accreditation Canada as part of a voluntary hospital-wide peer review program that evaluated QCH's performance against national healthcare standards of excellence.

Surveyors toured the hospital, directly observing care and talked to staff and patients about their experience. They reviewed patient records, other documentation and processes. Staff completed self-assessment surveys on how well QCH meets the standards.

The result? QCH recently received Accreditation with Exemplary Standing, the highest award possible. "This

external professional review process verifies our use of best practices to provide a safe and progressive care environment. It showcased the exemplary patient care that takes place at QCH daily," notes Tom Schonberg, President and CEO. "I couldn't be prouder of our team."

Building for the future – today

We're almost there! Phase Three, the largest of our ambitious expansion project, is well underway



This summer, the new four-storey patient care wing will open. The \$126 million James Beach Health Care Centre will be home to ten new surgical suites, a satellite Dialysis Clinic (a new program at QCH), an outpatient Rehabilitation Clinic and a new home for our Ambulatory Care Centre. Upcoming renovations will see enhanced and expanded Diagnostic Imaging facilities and equipment as well.

Already, patients are seeing the benefits. We recently celebrated the opening of the new Cardiopulmonary Department providing a much larger and more welcoming environment for patients and families.

And we won't stop there. We want to ensure our community gets the care it needs - close to home.
